THE DELFT HOMEWORK CLUB IS AN INITIATIVE OF BETTAWAY COMMUNITY CHURCH IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DELFT, CAPE TOWN. PRESENTLY THERE ARE 83 STUDENTS WHO ATTEND THE HOMEWORK CLUB EACH AFTERNOON AFTER SCHOOL. EACH HAS A DESK TO WORK AT, A LIGHT SNACK PROVIDED, AND ASSISTANCE WITH THEIR HOMEWORK.

THE SINEKAMVA TEAM'S VISION IS TO FOCUS ON CHILDREN AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT. THEY BELIEVE THAT THEIR FUTURE CAN BE BRIGHT THROUGH GOOD QUALITY EDUCATION, REGENERATION OF MORAL VALUES AND INTRODUCING CHRIST AS THE ULTIMATE SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEMS WALLACEDENE IS FACING. The Baptist Union are aware that they can pass names on to us of potential beneficiaries. We also ask you, as pastors and leaders, to let us know of people who may require our help.

WE INVESTIGATE



We then contact the person/s concerned. For accountability to SARS and The Department of Social Services, we require every person we support to disclose their monthly income. We also gather other relevant information from them.

WE START SUPPORT



If the individual's income falls within the parametres we have, we can then begin with support. Our commitment, God enabling us, is for a period of one year. We evaluate on a yearly basis. Our present support is R800/month
